SUBJECT: EMERGENCY TRANSPORTATION

The rather elaborate bus schedule now in operation should adequately provide the necessary transportation, and everyone is urged to adjust his travel in so far as possible with the schedule. The last bus to the Crawford House leaves The Mount Washington at 1:30 a.m. (Please consult the schedule effective July 4, 1944.) Should an emergency arise and transportation be needed after the last bus has left, the Military Barracks, branch 615, should be called and every effort will be made to meet the emergency. It will not be necessary to call other officers or other personnel of the Conference during the night. For emergency situations arising between 8:30 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. requests, of course, should be made of Mr. M. Hamilton Osborne, at the Transportation Office.

I believe everyone realizes that transportation cannot be supplied each individual at all hours, or that special automobiles cannot be furnished individual members of the Conference or Delegation, under present wartime conditions. Naturally it would be much more satisfactory to have a fleet of cars or taxis available on call, but this is absolutely out of the question.
